## **Saturday 26 March**

### **09:30 Session 3: Workshops (KVS)**

Together with Halma and WiPC we are presenting five intensive and fruitful workshops. The workshops run in parallel, please choose one where you would like to participate:

#### **1) Visa and migration**

The ability to travel and move to new places has always been important to writers. Sometimes to get inspiration, other times out of sheer necessity. The workshop will discuss the practical limitations and possibilities to travel and migration today. How can we influence authorities to make it easier for writers to be on the move? With representatives from ECRE, Danish PEN, the EU and reports from ICORN/PEN /Halma experiences in the field.

#### **2) Translation and publication**

Representatives from Halma, ICORN and PEN International will share their competence and experience from their fields. Remarkable translation and publication projects will be presented, while the participants will be challenged to bring in their own ideas and suggestions for new initiatives to be developed.

#### **3) Mobility and creativity**

The organisations Halma ([www.halma-network.eu](http://www.halma-network.eu)) and Literature Across Frontiers ([www.lit-across-frontiers](http://www.lit-across-frontiers)) have mobility and creativity at the heart of their agendas. What are the relations between being on the move and the creative processes? is one of the questions that will be raised and discussed in this workshop.

#### **4) Working with the EU**

EU policies on human rights and advocacy will be on the agenda in the first part of this workshop, before the focus is turned to EU funding in the human rights and cultural sector. Professional EU representatives will be around, and reports from Halma/ICORN/PEN experiences in the field will be shared and discussed.

## **5) Freedom of Expression**

“Post Wikileaks: digital media, dissidents and dictatorships” will be on the agenda in this workshop where representatives from PEN International’s Writers in Prison Committee will share competence and recent experience on these vibrant topics for the essential debates of today and tomorrow.
